are to overcome the disadvantage faced by some school students and I was inspired to hear the stories of business mentors who come back year after year to give the benefit of their experience to the coming generation.

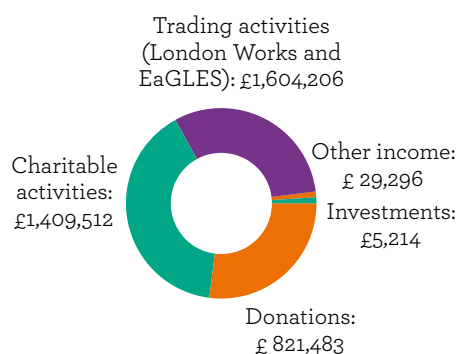

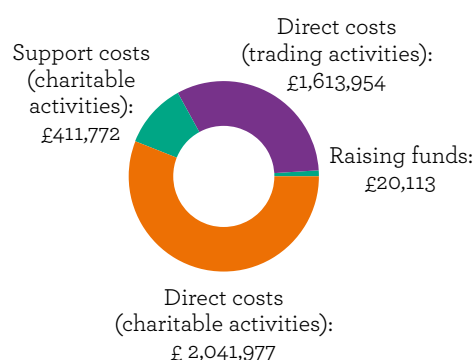

Expenditure:

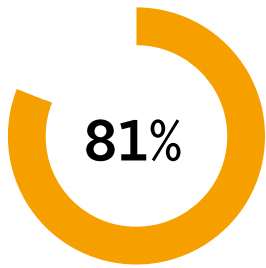

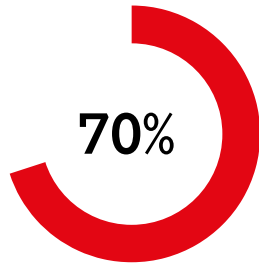

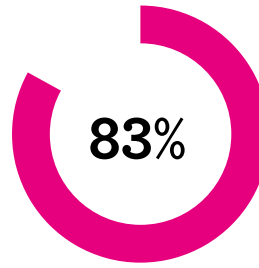

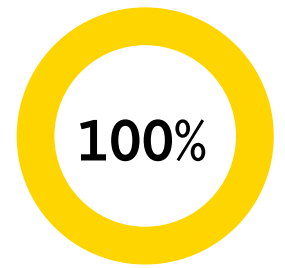
Gained hard skills, e.g. interview skills or CV skills



Long term change in their circumstances, e.g. they got a job or passed a test

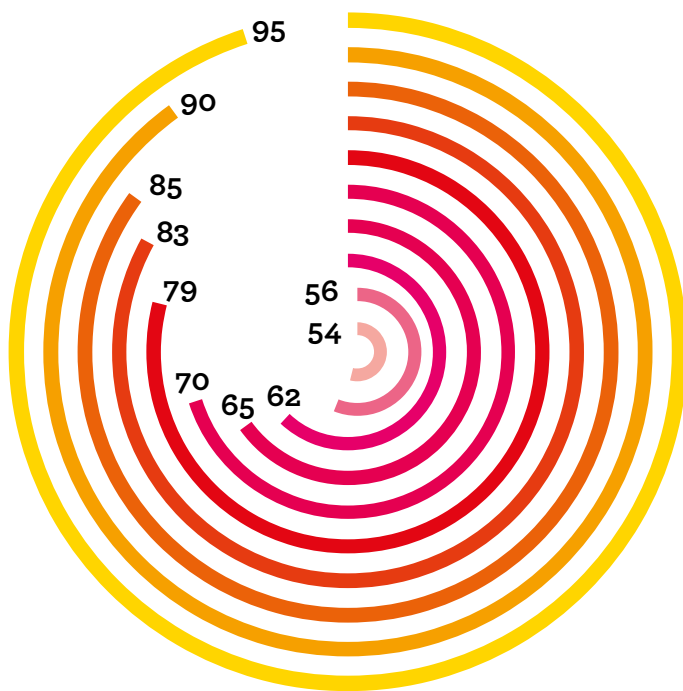
